NAFA full-time diploma / degree* students may apply for a Tertiary Student Concession Card which allows the cardholder to purchase Bus/Train/Hybrid Monthly Concession Passes.

*Master's students are not eligible for the Tertiary Student Concession Card

<u>Notes</u>

- Application is not compulsory. If you choose not to apply for the concession card or purchase the monthly concession pass, you will have to pay adult fares for travel on buses, MRT and LRT.
- If you have applied for admission to more than one tertiary institution, you should apply for the concession card only after you have confirmed your choice of institution. Your concession card application will be rejected if you have more than one record in the TransitLink database.
- The Concession Card can only be used from the start date of the NAFA programme, i.e. from 5 August 2024 onwards.

Application Exercise (15 July to 31 August 2024)

- a) You can apply for the Concession Card only <u>after</u> you have paid your first semester programme fee and (for international students) obtained the ICA Student's Pass.
- b) Check your eligibility for application (using your NRIC number or FIN) at the <u>TransitLink website</u>:
 Online Services
 - Check Application Status
 - Tertiary Student Concession Card (Diploma Student / Undergraduate)
- c) If you are eligible, you may proceed to submit your application via any one of the following modes:
 - Online application via <u>TransitLink website</u>
 - Online Services
 - New Application
 - Walk-in to any of the <u>SimplyGo Ticket Offices (TOs)</u>
 - Bring along your original NRIC / Passport / ICA Student's Pass
 - Make a payment of \$5 non-refundable card cost and \$3.10 non-refundable personalisation fee
- d) However, if your name is more than 32 characters (including spaces), you are required to walk-in to any of the <u>SimplyGo Ticketing Service Centres (TSCs)</u> to apply for the Concession Card as you have to shorten your name to not more than 32 characters (including spaces) for printing on the card.
- e) Please keep / print the receipt as proof of payment.

- f) TransitLink will send your Concession Card to NAFA on a weekly basis and the Office of Student Affairs (OSA) will distribute the card to you during Orientation.
- g) If you did not receive your Concession Card during Orientation, we will notify you via your NAFA email account once your card is ready for collection at the Student Services Counter (NAFA Campus 1, Wing A, Level 2).
- h) Once you have received your Concession Card, you must pay a minimum top-up of \$2 (diploma) or \$5 (degree) at any TOs to activate the card for use.

Application from 5 September 2024 onwards

Students who missed the application exercise (15 July – 31 August 2024) may apply for the Concession Card at <u>TransitLink website</u> or at the <u>SimplyGo Ticketing Service Centres (TSCs)</u> from 5 September 2024 onwards.
